MANAGER'S MESSAGE

From Carson Sweeney

It's that time of year: Cooperative business travel season

In early July I spent four days in New York City at a conference with our banking institution. This conference provides insight into where our economy is headed and how geopolitics impact the financial industry.

The following week I met with representatives of the National Forest Service in White Sulphur Springs to continue conversations on utility right of way and routing of powerlines.

I then traveled with three of our directors to Sidney for the Montana Electric Cooperatives' Association summer board meeting. This is a quarterly opportunity for electric cooperatives throughout the state to meet up and discuss legislative outcomes and cooperative business matters.

A few days later I met with utility leaders throughout the state to collaborate with Montana Department of Transportation officials on suggestions and implementation of new statutes recently signed into law.
