MANAGER'S MESSAGE

From Carson Sweeney

Cost of electricity from our suppliers will be increasing

On the heels of an enjoyable summer and a strong financial year at our electric cooperative, this month's message comes with recent news that the cost of electricity from our power suppliers will be increasing in January 2025. The Western Area Power Administration (WAPA), which transmits wholesale electricity across a 15-state region from 57 hydropower plants, has communicated a 7.5% rate increase. Basin Electric Power Cooperative has recently communicated that the 2025 rate may have to increase as much as 9.5%. To put these increases into perspective, we anticipate our annual cost of electricity to increase by approximately \$1,750,000.

The team at Fergus Electric Cooperative will be analyzing our financials and developing several options for our Board of Directors to review. I have previously shared with our membership that I am a supporter of smaller regular increases as compared to larger, more abrupt, increases. Throughout the next few months, I will be working through the data to understand how we can navigate these cost increases in a smooth and stable manner. Options for our board to consider will include postponing a rate increase until mid-year as well as spreading the necessary increase across multiple years.

As our discussions progress, I will provide regular and transparent information updates to the membership. As we work to understand the implications of these expected cost increases, please let me know if you have any questions.
